From the Desk of Rev. Fr. Angelo Maggos Parish Registry, Progress Report Upcoming Church Services and Events Youth Ministry and Organizations News

From Fr. Angelo

While most Orthodox are familiar with some of the services of Lent and Holy Week, few know the entire collection of services that make up the entire Lenten season and this is especially important for those who have recently joined our church through Chrismation. The joyous event of Christ's resurrection can only be fully appreciated through the journey of Lent. The Lenten journey is vital to fully prepare for the single greatest event of our Christian faith, the resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. For this reason, I want to take the time to provide this overview of the entire schedule of services.

OVERVIEW

The services of Great Lent are characterized by an atmosphere of a penitential character evident through noticeable differences. The royal gates to the altar area remain closed to remind us of Man's separation through sin from the Kingdom of God. The church vesting is of a somber color, usually purple and the 7-day candles are changed to purple. The daily hymns reflect this somber tone with a repentant and intercessory character, entreating God through His saints to have mercy on us sinners.

THE SERVICES OF LENT

The Lenten session consists of three distinct periods, Triodion, Great Lent, and Holy Week.

PREPARATION

The Triodion (Τριφδιον) period, which means "three odes" covers the preparatory weeks leading up to Holy Week. This period includes Sunday of the Publican and Pharisee, Sunday of the Prodigal Son and Sunday of the Last Judgment. Following this we prepare our bodies for the fasting period of Great Lent starting with Meatfare Sunday (Apókreō-literally: the "Leave-taking from Meat"). The following week, Cheesefare Sunday (Tyrinĕ, - literally: "Cheese Sunday") eliminates meat and dairy products from our diet.

During this period the Church also celebrates the Saturday of Souls ($\Psi\nu\chi\sigma\sigma\alpha\beta\beta\alpha\tau$) liturgies, of which there are three, we pray universally for all of the departed. The faithful offer koliva, and names of their departed are read during the Memorial portion of the service. The Scripture readings refer to the dead and their hope of salvation through Christ who has "defeated death by His death".

GREAT LENT

The Forty Days of Great Lent (Μεγαλη Σαρρακοστη), begin on Clean Monday (3 March) as the Orthodox do not have any equivalent to Ash Wednesday. This begins the full fast, although on two specific feasts during Lent (the Annunciation and Palm Sunday), fish is allowed. The fast lasts through Holy Week. On Clean Monday it is typical to conduct the Great Compline service where the Canon of St Andrew of Crete is read.

In most Greek Orthodox parishes, two services dominate the Forty Days of Lent: the Pre-Sanctified Liturgy held each Wednesday and the Salutations to the Theotokos on Fridays.

PRESANCTIFIED LITURGY

The Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts was first documented by St. Gregory the Dialogist (AD 540-604), who was the papal legate to Constantinople. The Presanctified Liturgy is a beautifully solemn evening service

combining elements of Vespers with the administration of Holy Communion added to it. There is no consecration of the Eucharist during the service as the Lamb (Body of Christ) has been pre-sanctified (consecrated) at the previous Sunday's liturgy. It comes after a day of spiritual preparation and offers the faithful who are unable to make the effort of total fasting because of weakness or work. Normally a light lenten meal is eaten in the morning or early afternoon. This service was initiated by the early Church to offer strength to the faithful during this time of increased struggle. The prayer of St. Ephraim of Syria that is repeated throughout this service clearly displays the repentance nature of this service:

O Lord and Master of my life: take from me the spirit of sloth, faint-heartedness, lust of power and idle talk.

But grant rather the spirit of chastity, humility, patience and love to Thy servant.

Lord and King, grant me to see my own errors and not to judge my brother, for blessed art Thou unto ages of ages. Amen.

SALUTATIONS AND AKATHIST

The Friday Salutation services that take place over the course of five (5) Fridays are conducted in place of the Pre-Sanctified Liturgy that is typically performed in the Antiochian and Slavic traditions. The hymn was composed in Constantinople, "the city of the Virgin," by St. Romanos the Melodist in the year 556. Each Friday, one part of the total Akathist service is sung with hymns by the chanter and stanzas by the priest ending with the refrain: "Rejoice, O Bride Unwedded." On the final Friday all 24 stanzas are sung by the priest.

These hymns and stanzas, while honoring the role that the Theotokos played in our salvation, it also prepares us for the Bridegroom services of Holy Week.

HOLY WEEK

Lazarus Saturday and Palm Sunday immediately precede our entrance into Holy Week and celebrate two significant events in the earthly life of our Lord: His final sign in returning His friend Lazarus to life after 4 days dead and His glorious entrance into the city of Jerusalem. Holy Week begins with the evening Matins of the Bridegroom service on Sunday night where the long Alleluia replaces the psalm: God is the Lord. Scripture readings from Genesis and Proverbs are added to Vespers, and the Prophecy of Isaiah to the Sixth Hour. Each of these books is read nearly in its entirety during the Lenten period. The remainder of Holy Week carries us ever deeper into the darkness of Christ's betrayal, arrest, torture, trial, and finally, crucifixion after which we emerge victorious with our Lord celebrating the event of His glorious resurrection and our gift of eternal salvation with Him in the Kingdom of Heaven.

The Bylaws outline the following:

Ouote:

Article V: Parish Chapter-Section 2 Membership Qualification:

- 1. Full Member-Women of the Greek Orthodox Faith, of at least 18 years of age, shall be eligible for full membership in the Society.
- 2. Associate Membership- A) An Associate Member shall enjoy all privileges of membership, except the right to vote or hold office. B) The following persons shall be eligible for associate membership: i. A non-Greek Orthodox woman married to a Greek Orthodox man. ii. Greek Orthodox men. iii. A non-Greek Orthodox man married to a Greek Orthodox woman.

Qualifications for Elections to the Chapter Board: A member of the Chapter Board shall:

- A. Be a full member of the Society;
- B. Be a member in good standing with the parish and chapter for a period at least one full year prior to the date of election to the Chapter Board;
- C. Have attended a minimum of four meetings of the Chapter in the previous year; and be present at the election meeting unless reasonable cause for such absence is provided. Further information will follow for the 2025-2027 year.



- 3. Start to discuss what you and your family are going to do for lent!



Hall Rental Policy for 962 East.

We are excited and eager to finally be able to safely reopen our beautifully renovated church Hall to our community. However, the new renovations, along with the intent to lease the Hall to non-parishioners also, requires us to establish a higher degree of formality regarding rental of the new Hall. To assist in this transition, we have secured a dedicated Hall Manager, Sara Tone, who will be responsible for maintaining the Hall Lease calendar, process booking for both parishioner and non-parishioner, showing of the Hall and coordinating contract requirements and signatures. Our church secretary is no longer responsible for Hall scheduling or coordinating any Hall lease activities. With this in mind, we are establishing the following set of guidelines when leasing our Hall.

Attached is a pricing schedule and usage guide for both parishioners and non-parishioners. The fee to rent the Hall for a Parishioner in Good Standing is \$500 total. A signed Rental Agreement and payment of lease fee are required to reserve a date. All guests are expected to respect all Hall rules laid out in the Hall Lease Agreement. All trash and food stuffs must be disposed of properly at the end of your event. See the Hall Lease Agreement for specific information on the use of decorations.

To qualify for the parishioner rate, the person leasing the Hall must be a member in Good Standing for the current year. *Member in Good Standing* status requires a stewardship card on file for the current year and a reasonable payment amount made towards the current year's stewardship pledge.

To begin the Hall Lease process please go to the homepage of our Annunciation Church website. At the bottom of the home page, you will see a button labeled "Hall Rental." Click there to fill out the request form and you will then be contacted by our Hall Manager.

Note that use of the Hall for recognized church organizations or ministries is at no cost, however they are still required to complete the <u>Hall reservation form</u>, to ensure their dates are blocked from use by the Hall manager. This form can be accessed at the bottom of the home page of our church website.

Generally speaking, Hall rental includes the following. (Please see the HALL Contract for the full details)

- a) Six (6) hours of rental time
- b) Tables and chairs setup according to a previously agreed upon floor plan*
- c) Limited kitchen access (warming and cold storage privileges only)
- d) Hall cleaned prior to event
- e) Trash bins and bags

The six (6) hours of rental time does not count against setup time and the timing for this should be arranged with the Hall Manager. This rental does not include the following.

- a) Linens for tables, glassware, flatware, and china
- Food service utensils and dishes

Full kitchen privileges requires a \$350 kitchen usage fee if the food will be prepared using the Hall kitchen(s). If the lessee plans on using a catering service that cater, if they are not on the Approved Cater List, must be approved by the Hall Manager prior to use of the Hall kitchen(s).

* Set-up of the hall does not include taking down or removing any tables due to lack of personnel to do this.

Parishioners are free to take down tables but must reset them after the event. Taking tables down could be done through the set-up fee. For non-parishioners events set-up fees are added to the lease price.

We appreciate your patience and understanding as we transition to this new policy which we believe will serve to benefit us both from a financial and community perspective.

Annunciation Policies

MEMORIAL FUNDS DISTRIBUTION POLICY

All monies received during a funeral or memorial service that are made out to the church, that is, checks marked with "Annunciation Greek Orthodox Church" or cash with the envelope marked with "Annunciation Greek Orthodox Church" will be used for purposes in support of church operation.

These could include support of recognized church ministries, sacramental articles purchased for the church proper or for ongoing campaigns such as Hall Renovation or other capita improvements.

If it is desired that these monies are to be used for other wishes that the family may have the family must ensure that they announce that these checks or cash be designated as such.

All monies received for funerals are tracked and family members will receive a listing of those who donated, typically within 40-60 days following the date of the funeral. In addition, for all monies received designated "Annunciation Greek Orthodox Church," donors will receive a letter thanking them for their donation to the church in memory of the deceased.

POLICY FOR DOCUMENT PREPARATION:

There is a required processing charge of \$40 per document. This charge covers research, preparation and routing of documents such as Certificate of Residency, Certificate of Freedom to Marry, Reissued Marriage Certificate, Reissued Baptism Certificate and Certificate of Death. Additional documents are \$20.00 per document.

WEDDINGS:

We have wedding candles in the office for purchase which is required at the time of the ceremony. The donation for the plain one is \$30.00. \$100 would be for the decorated ones. Lena has them in the office. The Stefanas are sold out - Lena does have catalogs for Stefanas in the Office if anyone is interested in shopping on-line.

BAPTISMS:

We also have baptismal candles, \$30 for the large plain candle. A decorated candle is \$50.00.

MEMORIALS:

The family which is sponsoring the Memorial is asked to:

- 1. Contact the Parish Secretary to arrange scheduling the memorial for that day.
- 2. Coordinate the preparation and delivery of Koliva (if used). The Church Office can provide information on persons who can prepare Koliva. The standard rate for the preparation of Koliva is \$150.
- 3. Provide Coffee Hour food items.
