What is the Clergy-Laity All About?

Part of the life of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America, is the Clergy-Laity Congress. More than just a gathering of people, the Congress is a living expression of the Church that brings together clergy and laity from across the United States to discuss, strategize, reflect, and prayerfully discern the best path forward together.

Each year carries a specific theme and this year that theme is Rise and Build, inviting us to consider our joint (clergy and laity) sacred responsibility entrusted to us as members of the Body of Christ. This theme is especially relevant today with the large number of people desiring to convert to the Orthodox faith. Our parishes must be ready to rise to this challenge and build a supportive community that addresses their needs but at the same time preserves the wonderful legacy of our Greek heritage. And this cannot be accomplished independently. Through gathering of all the parishes of America our Orthodox Church is strengthened, and renewed through the interaction of parishioners from various parishes each offering their best practices, and lessons learned...and the Clergy Laity provides the perfect venue for this shared interaction.

The Clergy-Laity Congress also serves several other essential purposes. It provides a forum for shared governance, where delegates discuss administrative and canonical responsibilities and challenges both at an Archdiocese and parish level. These issues include yearly Archdiocese allocations from each parish, guidance on the administration of sacraments, leadership challenges and discussions on how to effectively deal with changing societal norms and other important issues. Through workshops and speakers, clergy and laity learn about opportunities for their ministries, equipping them with practical tools and resources. And, perhaps most importantly, it fosters a sense of unity, as parishioners make lasting friendships and return to their home parishes with experiences that remind all of us that no parish exists in isolation, but as part of a larger ecclesial body.

Equally important is the sense of connection that the Congress fosters. In a country as large and diverse as the United States, it is all too possible for parishes to feel isolated in their struggles and limited in their resources. Both clergy and lay leaders return not simply with information, but with renewed vision. They carry with them ideas for ministry development, insights into emerging challenges, and practical strategies that can be adapted to the unique needs of their parishes. Clergy Laity brings together all types of parishes are represented from small parishes of fewer than 100 families to larger parishes like ours, each having their own unique challenges. And at Clergy-Laity similar parish leaders can get together to share concerns and learn different approaches suited to their parish size and makeup. Whether it is strengthening stewardship efforts, expanding youth engagement, enhancing liturgical life, or navigating the realities of a rapidly changing

The Clergy-Laity Congress also offers a unique window into the experience of Orthodoxy in America. It reflects the diversity of our faithful, the breadth of our ministries, and the ongoing effort to live out an ancient faith in a modern world. It is a place where tradition and mission meet, where the richness of Orthodox liturgy and theology is brought into conversation with the realities of contemporary life.

In this way, the Clergy-Laity conference is not only about internal life. It is also about learning from others how to best witness the True Faith to the world. How we gather, how we deliberate, and how we move forward together speaks to the broader story of Orthodoxy in this country. It demonstrates a Church that is engaged, thoughtful, and committed to building a community of faith that will endure for generations.

Dear Annunciation Parishioners,

What a year. We are so thankful for your support of this year's Greek Festival. Between our hardworking volunteers, generous sponsors, and the energy of the Rochester community, this was another record-breaking year. Food lines stretched into the marketplace tent all four days, while Saturday was the busiest single day in festival history! We sold out of lamb shank, pastitsio, moussaka, and keftedes by Sunday evening and we even sold out of FIX Beer!

While we're still tallying final numbers, the total incoming festival revenue this year was roughly \$630,000 (with expenses still to be determined) – greatly surpassing the prior record by \$90,000!

Our success however, is bittersweet, as we carry with us the loss of Olga Kiriakidis. To her family and friends, our love and prayers are with you. May her memory be eternal.

It truly does take a village, and ours showed up in full force.

None of this starts on festival weekend - it starts months earlier, with the volunteers who were already prepping, baking, and cooking. HALL RENTAL POLICY

The Parish Council has decided to allow hall access and rentals to **only** Parishioners & Church Ministries/Groups moving forward. All inquiries and bookings will be handled by the Church Secretary who can be contacted at office@agocroc.org or by calling 585-244-3377.

The fee to rent the Hall for a Parishioner in Good Standing is \$500 total. A signed agreement and payment of the above fee is required to reserve your event date. **Please note that the use of the Hall for recognized Church organizations or ministries is at no cost; however, they are still required to contact the Church Office and reserve the hall through proper channels in order to secure their date.**

All guests are expected to respect the following hall rules:

- All trash, décor, and any foodstuffs must be disposed of properly at the end of your event and brought outside
- No décor or other items can be adhered to any surfaces in the hall.
- Cooking in the kitchen is **prohibited** unless approved by Fr. Angelo/ Parish Council and a \$350 kitchen fee is paid in advance.
- The premises **must** be vacated no later than 10:00 pm.
- The premises must be left as it was found - any excess tables and chairs stowed away properly, new trash bags in bins, etc.

Hall Rentals for Parishioners & Church Groups/ Ministries include the following:

- Six (6) Hours of rental time (or as much needed as approved by Fr. Angelo)
- Access to tables & chairs
- Warming, storage & Ice use in the kitchen
- Access to coffee makers (coffee, creamer, sugar, cups, etc. not included)
- Hall cleaned prior to the event
- Trash bins & bags
- On site parking lot security

The six (6) hours of rental time does not count against setup time and the timing for this should be arranged with the Church Office. This rental **does not include** the following:

- Floorplan set up
- Linens for tables, glassware, flatware, and china
- Food service utensils, buffet equipment, etc.

Payments can be made via cash, check or via the online portal once you have signed your rental agreement. Please reach out to the Church Office with any questions! Thank you so much for your continued support.



Annunciation Policies

MEMORIAL FUNDS DISTRIBUTION POLICY

All monies received during a funeral or memorial service that are made out to the church, that is, checks marked with “Annunciation Greek Orthodox Church” or cash with the envelope marked with “Annunciation Greek Orthodox Church” will be used for purposes in support of church operation.

These could include support of recognized church ministries, sacramental articles purchased for the church proper or for ongoing campaigns such as Hall Renovation or other capita improvements.

If it is desired that these monies are to be used for other wishes that the family may have the family must ensure that they announce that these checks or cash be designated as such.

All monies received for funerals are tracked and family members will receive a listing of those who donated, typically within 40-60 days following the date of the funeral. In addition, for all monies received designated “*Annunciation Greek Orthodox Church*,” donors will receive a letter thanking them for their donation to the church in memory of the deceased.

POLICY FOR DOCUMENT PREPARATION:

There is a required processing charge of \$40 per document. This charge covers research, preparation and routing of documents such as Certificate of Residency, Certificate of Freedom to Marry, Reissued Marriage Certificate, Reissued Baptism Certificate and Certificate of Death. Additional documents are \$20.00 per document.

WEDDINGS:

We have wedding candles in the office for purchase which are required at the time of the ceremony. The donation for the plain one is \$30.00. \$100 would be for the decorated ones. Catalogs for Stefanos are in the Office if anyone is interested in shopping on-line

BAPTISMS:

We also have baptismal candles, \$30 for the large plain candle. A decorated candle is \$50.00.

MEMORIALS:

The family which is sponsoring the Memorial is asked to:

1. Contact the Parish Secretary to arrange scheduling the memorial for that day.
2. Coordinate the preparation and delivery of Koliva (if used). The Church Office can provide information on persons who can prepare Koliva. The standard rate for the preparation of Koliva is \$150.
3. Provide Coffee Hour food items.
